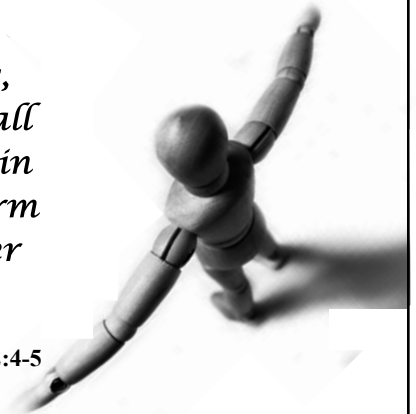

Dear Friends,

One reason you need to be actively involved in the life of your church family is to fulfil your calling to serve other believers in practical ways. The Bible says,

“All of you together are Christ’s body, and each one of you is a separate and necessary part of it”

1 Corinthians 12:27

Your service is essential to the body of Christ. Each of us has a role to play, and every role is important. There is no small service to God; it all matters.

What would happen? Your body would die.

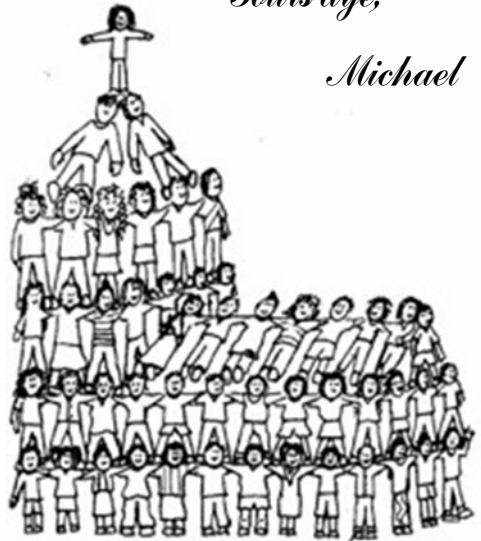
Today many local churches are dying because of Christians who are unwilling to serve. They sit on the side lines as spectators, and the body suffers.

KIRK SESSION NOTES

The Kirk Session met on 19 March 2019.

The major item of business concerned the proposal to redevelop the Manse site to provide a new Manse. Various options had been considered. The question of purchasing an existing property or a new property had been investigated – none had been found to meet the requirements laid down for a Manse by the General Trustees.

The question of refurbishing the existing Manse had also been investigated. This had indicated that a figure of around £94,000 would require to be spent over the next few years but with no guarantee that this would be exhaustive and without the ability to make any significant inroads into improving the energy inefficiency.

The fourth option was to enter into agreement with a developer whereby a new Manse would be constructed adjacent to the existing Manse, the existing Manse then demolished and 2 other houses built on the site. Diligence had been carried out in relation to the value of the site and the costs of building the new Manse. Following consideration of the figures it was established that there would be a £43,300 shortfall to be met by the Church. This was significantly lower than the refurbishment costs along with the added benefit of a very efficient energy situation.

Following consideration, the Session agreed to adopt this scheme. Approvals were received from the Presbytery and the General Trustees. Planning permission has been sought. In addition application was made to the General Trustees for a grant/loan to cover the deficit of £43,300. I am delighted to advise that the General Trustees have awarded a grant of the whole deficit sum of £43,300!

The session also approved the Local Church Review documentation for submission to

Presbytery and awaits a visit from the Presbytery's representatives.

Session noted that the Records of the Church would be attested by Presbytery on 26 March.

The Accounts of the Church were also approved following a presentation from the Treasurer.

PRESBYTERY NOTES

Since the last issue of the magazine the Presbytery met on 5 February 2019 and 5 March 2019.

The February meeting paid tribute to Mr Ian Rice, Presbytery Elder for Larkhall: Trinity following his death and noted the retirement of Rev James Gibson from Bothwell. Permission was granted to Dalserf to sell the Manse. The programme for the visit of the Moderator of the General Assembly from 9 to 18 March was approved – this included a visit to Viewpark to the ViewCare Project on 13 March.

The March meeting paid tribute to Rev Neil Buchannan, East Kilbride, Moncrieff on the occasion of his retirement and noted the planned retirement of Rev Douglas Wallace, East Kilbride: Stewartfield. It was noted that the Kirk Session of Motherwell: Dalziel St Andrew's had voted not to depart from the Church's historic stance in relation to human sexuality. Commissioners were appointed for the General Assembly of 2019. Presbytery noted the resignation of Rev Robbie Hamilton as Depute Clerk. A report was received from the Church & Society Committee on Stigma Free relating to mental health.

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ThroughCare

We continue to support vulnerable individuals by providing essential items for young men and, more recently, young women, newly liberated from prison.

These youngsters are often installed in very basic temporary accommodation, usually over a weekend, when support services are unable to help them. They can feel lonely and isolated and have only an electric kettle as a way of providing hot food or

a drink. We try to supply them with 'starter' items to get them through that first difficult weekend. Items we provide include:

- Hand towels
- Bath towels
- Soap
- Washing up cloths
- Energy bars
- Crisps / Snacks
- A drinking cup/mug
- Facecloths
- Tea towels
- Washing up liquid
- Energy drinks
- Pot noodles
- Cup-a-soup

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CHRISTIANS AGAINST POVERTY (CAP)

Lesley and I enjoyed a fantastic visit to the Iona Community on Easter Sunday. The Abbey was full and we both remarked on the joint spirit of peace throughout the whole service. Afterwards we attended a talk from a husband and wife team who are ministers in the Anglican tradition in London. The preacher at the service, John Bell, was fantastic and inspirational.

Of the many principals that really chime with me is "Everyone should have the quality and dignity of a full life, with adequate physical, social and political opportunity without the oppression of poverty, injustice and fear".

CAP continues to operate at 100% capacity in our community. In addition to the ongoing appointments that we carry out, follow-up visits to clients who wish to re-engage with CAP are done in the evening. The moment when people call our 0800 328 0006 number and admit they need help is a huge step for them to take. It is no wonder then that sometimes they step back and reconsider their options. Just supplying breathing space to people is all that is needed and CAP will always allow clients to re-engage at any time.

Five members of the team went to the Edinburgh Spring CAP Conference. I secured a "family" train ticket which allowed me to be in charge of the tickets at least!

We met other CAP workers from around Scotland and saw that, without doubt, the

Church of Scotland is fully on board with the work of CAP.

In May I will be assisting CAP in the Church of Scotland's Princess Street Gardens event. This details the many outreaches in the work of our Church in Scotland.

In June we are hosting another Revive conference in Shettleston New which is Louis' new church. If you would like to come along to any of these events just ask me.

Lesley and I both "passed" the requirements to run the CAP money course. We had to go through to another Church of Scotland in snowy Wester Hailles, Edinburgh. We are planning to run this course in the autumn once we have secured helpers and arranged with View Café for the provision of some food. 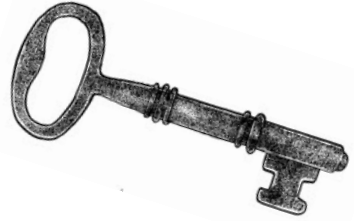

The Key

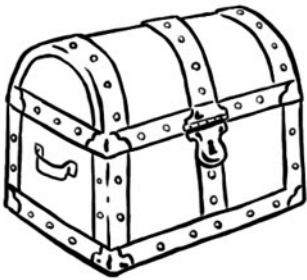
You've been handed a key from God.
